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CSE Programmes in Seethawaka

The Seethawaka Service Delivery Point conducted Comprehensive Sexuality Education programmes at Wahakula Kanishta Vidyalaya and Waharaka Maha Vidyalaya. Covering reproductive health, HIV/STI awareness, counselling, and life skills, the sessions equipped students with essential knowledge to make informed decisions. More than 330 students participated, demonstrating strong engagement and interest.



Promoting SRH Awareness

FPA Sri Lanka contributed to the Post-Orientation Programme 2026 of the Faculty of Indigenous Social Sciences and Management Studies. Dr. Chinthia Rupasinghe – Director SRH facilitated a session on Sexual and Reproductive Health Awareness, empowering undergraduates with accurate information on healthy relationships, well-being, and informed decision-making as they begin their university journey.



UNFPA and CSOs Discuss Sri Lanka's Future Priorities

UNFPA Asia-Pacific Regional Director a.i. Dr. Aleksandar Sasha Bodirosa and UNFPA Representative a.i. Phuntsho Wangyel met with civil society organizations, including FPA Sri Lanka. FPA shared its work on youth development, SGBV prevention, emergency response, youth-led initiatives, and hotline counselling, highlighting the value of community-driven partnerships and collaboration.



Empowering Youth Through Peer-Led CSE

A Comprehensive Sexuality Education Roll-Out Session was conducted for youth in the Mundalama MOH Division, facilitated by trained youth leaders from the Youth Network for Health – Puttalam (RFSU Project). Participants explored puberty, reproductive health, menstruation, pregnancy, and STIs. The programme demonstrated the effectiveness of peer education in strengthening youth knowledge and community engagement.



Mobile SRH Clinic Brings Services Closer to Factory Workers

Under the Levi's Grant Project, the Seethawaka SDP conducted a mobile clinic at CBL (Munchee) Exports Pvt. Ltd. in the Seethawaka Export Processing Zone. Workers received sexual and reproductive health consultations and counselling services in a convenient workplace setting, improving access to quality care and strengthening community health outcomes.



Psychology Internship Programme

The Alokaya Counselling Centre commenced its second internship programme of the year for psychology graduates. The initiative provides practical experience, professional development opportunities, and exposure to community-based counselling services. Interns will strengthen their skills while supporting ethical and responsible psychological care for diverse populations.



Sustainable Social Entrepreneurship Training

FPA Sri Lanka concluded the Sustainable Social Entrepreneurship Business Module under the IPPF Stream II Sex Work Consortium Policy Project. Over five days, participating organizations developed social enterprise concepts designed to enhance sustainability. Continued technical assistance, financial support, and mentorship will help transform these concepts into operational enterprises with long-term impact.



Strengthening Community Resilience Through Disaster Preparedness

The Batticaloa Service Delivery Point participated in the Disaster Management Working Group Discussion held at the Koralapattu Central Divisional Secretariat under the IPPF SPRINT Project. The meeting focused on strengthening disaster preparedness, community resilience, and coordinated disaster risk reduction efforts to better protect vulnerable populations during emergencies.



Supporting Adolescent Well-Being Through School-Based Education

The Koggala Service Delivery Point organized a Comprehensive Sexuality Education Programme at Hapugala Maha Vidyalaya. Facilitated by Dr. Nalin Wijesekara, the session encouraged students to discuss key health and well-being topics while building positive life skills. The programme supports FPA Sri Lanka's ongoing efforts to promote the health, well-being, and informed decision-making of adolescents.
