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Inclusive SRHR Education

As part of the RFSU-supported disability and SRHR project, follow-up evaluations were conducted in special education schools in Chilaw and Jaffna assessed classroom delivery by teachers previously trained on SRHR topics and sign language terminology. The initiative helps ensure that deaf students have equitable access to accurate, age-appropriate health information and supports more inclusive learning environments.

FPA Youth, in collaboration with the Nuravi Foundation, conducted a Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) session for students of Upananda College, Manawila, Galle. The session, led by Dr. Amila Chandrasiri with facilitation by Mrs. Chishani Thenuwara Attorney-at-Law, engaged 250 students in meaningful learning on SRHR.



Youth Action and Community Outreach

Members of the Kilinochchi SDP Youth Club met to discuss expanding outreach to remote communities and planning future awareness programmes on SRHR and gender-based violence.
